You have asked me rather a hard question - & the
more so because I don't see whether you want a single
word, or an expressive adjective combined with "zone" - which
indeed is the only plan I can think of. In the latter
case, you would have the N \pm zone, & the S \pm zone.

I could suggest plenty of adjectives to replace \pm - but none
that I much like - however here goes for a choice. -

Inarched (from the process of inarching as applied to trees -
i.e. connecting the branches by grafting.)

Interlaced. (not good - you want to express the summits only.)

Reflex.

Intertwoven - subject to the same objection as interlaced.

Recurved (but the zone is not recurved, only the rays in it)

If you want a fine Greek name, you may call them the Ana-
campic or Encampic or Epicampic or Syncampic
zones. - More classically bad - but would they not be thought
needless finesse? - The Solar Rev. Robins? -
