We hope to see you somehow on that Thursday - we shall be at the Bedford as usual. - I think Southampton Row is little out of your way from home to chambers - will you do us the favour to call at the Bedford & say we intend to sleep there 15<sup>th</sup> - & shall want 1 bedroom on ground floor on 1<sup>st</sup> floor - with ~~only~~ small sitting room - & another double bedded room 2<sup>d</sup> floor. - we should come in by one of the early Dover trains. - Hope you are quite well, & your good parents. We are beginning to prosper - our earlier days having been damaged by bad weather & the illness of one of the young ladies. We leave tomorrow for Freiburg - & shall then <sup>be</sup> going on daily (except Sunday) on our way. But we intend to stay Sunday at Hotel du Grand, Coblenz, should there be occasion to write - but I shall take no news for good news.
